

# **National Taiwan Normal University Directions Governing Credit-based Program for Cultivating Seniors Service Talent in Community**

Approved at the 2<sup>nd</sup> Academic Affairs Committee in 2017-2018 academic year on April 25, 2018

1. The Credit-based Program for Cultivating Seniors Service Talent in Community (the “Program”) is established in accordance with the Establishment Regulations for Credit-based Programs at National Taiwan Normal University (the “University”) to foster talents in the planning and implementation of community health services for the elderly. The Program is offered under the College of Education and undertaken by the Office of Student Affairs.
2. All students enrolled in the University may apply to take this Program during their studies.
3. Selection for this Program is conducted in the second semester of each academic year. The application schedule is announced separately. The selection is primarily based on document review. Students are required to submit relevant documents according to the application form. An interview may be conducted if necessary.
4. The quota for this Program shall be 50 students each academic year.
5. A total of 12 credits shall be completed, including 6 required credits and 6 elective credits; the elective courses may not all be offered by the same department. For course details, refer to the Class Roster for the Program.
6. If a student has already taken and passed the same or a similar course in this Program, the credit(s) may be recognized after review and approval.
7. Students who are selected into the Program and have completed the courses and credits required for this Program may submit an application and transcript for review and approval by the Office of Student Affairs to apply for the issuance of a certificate of completion from the Office of Academic Affairs.
8. The payment of credit fees for this Program shall be handled in accordance with fee collection standards for students of each academic system in the University.
9. Students who have been selected into this Program but have yet to complete the required courses and credits during their studies may apply to continue to undertake this Program during their master’s or doctoral studies at an NTU System School.
10. Matters not stipulated in the Directions shall be governed by relevant University regulations.
11. These Directions and any amendments thereto shall become effective after approval by the Academic Affairs Committee.
